Abstract

This collection of photographs, notes, reports, charts, maps, vital records, military records and land records comprises the genealogical research performed by Dorothy Barco Bangert on the Barco family of Currituck, Camden and surrounding counties (including associated collateral lines). The primary research subjects identified in the collection are: William Barco, Bailey Barco, Bailey Jones Barco, William Tillett Barco and Simeon Jones Barco. Included in the collection are military service records from the Revolutionary War through WWII, as well as many unique personal family documents, news articles and photographs collected by the author during the course of her research. Some associated families mentioned are: Jones, Brockett, Downing, Tillett, and Dozier.

Biographical Note

Dorothy Barco Bangert was born in Brooklyn, New York in 1932, the daughter of William Thomas Barco and Lillian B. Jones.

Scope and Content Note

The collection is comprised of photocopies of materials on the Barcos and their associated families collected by Dorothy Barco Bangert during the course of her family research. Included are a mixture of reproductions of notes, photographs, primary and secondary documents and abstracts and transcriptions of information pertaining to the Barco family and their associated collateral lines. Mrs. Bangert's correspondence with other Barco Family researchers and relatives also forms a portion of the collection. The source of many of the notes and research aids included in the papers are not identified; in those cases the documents are marked "unattributed" in the calendar of papers.

Arrangement and Collection

This collection is arranged into two spiral binders, each subdivided into sections containing the relevant documents:
