### Abstract

Discovered in the attic of the W.W. Jarvis house by Mrs. Campbell in 2012, this important collection of original records spanning the period 1751-1909 includes: correspondence, deeds (from 1751), wills, slave, tax, court, business, household and financial records related to the Barnard and Jarvis families of Moyock in Currituck County, N.C. Mrs. Campbell's great-great uncle, John Etheridge Barnard, served as sheriff of Currituck County in the early 1900s, and as a result a number of legal and tax documents naming other individuals forms a part of this collection. Research performed by the staff of the library reveals that a number of these documents are one of a kind, and are not available in any other local repository.

### Biographical Note

John Barnard, born in 1806, became a prominent plantation owner in Moyock, NC during the nineteenth century. In addition, he served in the NC Senate from 1846-1850. He was a staunch Unionist and walked a fine line during the Civil War defending the local area from guerilla activity. In the years following the Civil War, he transferred his lands and power to his son John E. Barnard, b. 1845, who served as sheriff of Currituck County during the later nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. John Barnard died in 1893. John Barnard's daughter Luna Barnard married Thomas L. Jarvis, b. 1849, of Camden County. They lived on family lands in Moyock, NC given to them by John Barnard. Thomas and Luna's son William was the grandfather of Elizabeth Jarvis Campbell.

### **Chronology**

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection is comprised of archival photocopies of original document discovered by Elizabeth Jarvis Campbell in the attic of the W.W. Jarvis house in 2012. The deeds, slave transactional records, promissory notes, personal financial and business records offer a unique glimpse into the live of the Barnard and Jarvis families from about 1751 to the early 20<sup>th</sup> century. John Etheridge Barnard's position as sheriff of Currituck County and the records he accumulated during his tenure offer the researcher an invaluable selection of court and tax documents for the County. A number of the land and legal documents are one-of-a-kind originals that do not appear to have been recorded anywhere else.

### **Arrangement and Collection**

This collection is arranged into three spiral binders (Binder 1, Binder 1 – Part 2, and Binder 2) each representing exact reproductions of the binders as received from Mrs. Campbell, in chronological order. Cover pages identify the individual sections and their general contents and date spans. Many of the older documents have been transcribed by Library staff, and those accompanying transcriptions are inserted before the original document. Name indexes have been created and are located at the end of Binder 1 (Binder 1, Part 2) and at the end of Binder 2.
